This semester, two CWIT Scholars travelled across the Atlantic to take part in a truly unique educational adventure...studying abroad in Manchester, England. Here are their stories:

"Studying abroad has been the best decision I have ever made. I have met a ton of new people from all around the world, became a more mature and outgoing person, and to top it all off I have really immersed myself in a culture overseas. In order to meet my wide variety of friends from Chili, France, Austria, India, Hong Kong, and of course the UK, I had to reach outside my comfort zone. These friendships have taught me about many different cultures, and as well as few random foreign words. "Studying abroad has been the most amazing and shocking cultural experience I've ever experienced. I have travelled to Europe twice before for short two week trips.
