T-SITE Update Family, Support, Reassurance, Encouragement, Inspiration, Motivation, Fun

These are the words that T-SITE scholars used when asked in a recent focus group to describe their experience as part of the CWIT community. The T-SITE scholars program is funded by an S-STEM grant from the National Science Foundation (DUE-1154300-in its fourth of five years) to serve a total of 28 academically talented transfer students majoring in engineering or computing who have financial need, with a focus on women and other underrepresented groups. A fourth and final cohort of nine T-SITEs being funded on the current grant has been selected and will join the CWIT community this fall. Our T-SITE scholars are a wildly successful group and embody excellence in diversity! Three quarters of the 28 scholars selected are women or African American. Like most transfer students, T-SITES are have their eyes on their future career. This May more three T-SITEs are graduating and four more are on track to graduate in August or December. The T-SITE faculty mentors (Dr. Taryn Bayles, Dr. Marie desJardins, Dr. Carolyn Seaman, Dr. Anne Spence, and Dr. Gymama Slaugther-project coPIs) are an integral part of T-SITE scholar success. Nishay Raja talked about her faculty mentor like this- "I think Dr. Spence is awesome. She's helped me through everything. ...she tells me what you need to do and what classes to take. So that's always been very helpful, even my research was through her as well. We also have some great news about the T-SITE program-it will continue! Another S-STEM project (DUE-1458343) was funded in April to serve 25 more transfer students majoring in computing. Dr. Penny Rheingans, CWIT Director, is the Principal investigator. Dr. Carolyn Seaman (IS Department), Dr. Susan Martin (CWIT), and Dr. Charles LaBerge (CSEE) are coPIs on this new project.
